

# CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT PETITION FORM

\* Phone Number and Email Address are not required for a complete petition. 104.185 – A person who knowingly signs a petition or petitions for a candidate, minor political party, or an issue more than one time commits a misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083.

*Ballot Title:* End Corporate Welfare  
*Ballot Summary:* Prohibits the State and its political subdivisions from transferring tax revenue or granting tax reductions of any type to private businesses of any description, with exceptions of purchases of property, goods or services, and the payment of damages and costs. Allows individuals to bring enforcement actions in court. Eliminates the selective tax treatment of particular businesses or classes of businesses.

*Full Text of proposed Amendment:*

BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF FLORIDA THAT:  
Article VII Section 1 of the Florida Constitution is amended to read “Taxation; appropriations; state expenses; state revenue limitation; prohibited expenditures—” and to include the following new subsection:

(f) The State, counties, school districts, municipalities, or special districts may not disburse tax revenue of any type to any business, class of business, or private organization conducting business either directly, through rebates, or other tax abatement, other than for the payment of contractual obligations for the procurement of goods and services or purchase of property by the State, counties, school districts, municipalities, or special districts. A business or private organization conducting business is any entity, including corporations, partnerships, and sole proprietorships, that offers goods or services for sale, whether or not operated for profit. This subsection does not prohibit or otherwise limit the payment of damages or costs as otherwise provided herein or by law. This subsection does not prohibit or limit in any way the reduction of taxes of any description for all businesses or private organizations subject to the tax at issue. All current laws, contracts, programs, or ordinances currently in effect that violate this subsection may not be renewed, extended, or modified except to provide for termination of such law, contract, program, or ordinance. The legislature shall create a *qui tam* cause of action allowing individual persons to bring enforcement actions against the business in violation under this provision and individually recover at least twenty-five percent (25%) of the amount in violation of this provision, plus costs and attorneys fees, with the remainder returned to the government subdivision involved. This subsection shall become effective immediately upon approval by the electors of Florida.
